

EXECUTIVE LLM IN MADRID

Northwestern Pritzker School of Law, along with IE Law School (<https://www.ie.edu/law-school/degrees/executive-llm/>), offers a program in an executive format that awards a Master of Law (LLM) from Northwestern Law and a Certificate in Business Administration from IE Law. Administered by two of the world's leading law schools, the program is business-law focused and covers American common law, its application in international practice, and management essentials.

Program Structure

The program is intended to be flexible for participants from all over the world. Students can continue to work as they complete both in-classroom and online instruction.

In the Executive Program, participants complete intensive two-week sessions on the Chicago and Madrid campuses in addition to online coursework. The format allows students to earn their degree while taking minimal time away from their other obligations.
