Additional Degree Requirements

- **Final Evaluations:** none specified beyond the PhD degree requirements outlined in the Graduate Study at Northwestern University section of this Web site
- **Other:** demonstration of advanced competence in a second natural language. (For non-native English speakers, advanced competence in English satisfies this requirement.)
